Wednesda-SJ 29thjanuar-SJ 1902

This morning I finished my sketch of Hussain Sagar. Brother got fever from indigestion towards afternoon. He felt very restless and ill. In the evening we called in Dr KP. Popat a Parsee doctor having large practice [sic].

Thursda-SJ 30th januar-SJ 1902

The day was spent at home working. Brother had free motions and after that he felt better. He is weak no doubt. I think of leaving tomorrow morning for Bombay to see the art show. In the evening I visited Raja Deen Dayal at his house.

Frida-SJ 3 1 stjanuar-SJ 1902

I left by 6 a.m. train for Bombay. I had as my fellow passenger Mr Cawasji Cursetji Jhanawalla, the son of the Dewan of Ratlam. He is a customs officer in N amsari in the Gaikwar's Service. The journey was uneventful. Through the day was warm the night became cold.

## Saturda-SJ 1 st F ebruar-SJ 1 902

Reached Byculla this morning and was met by nephew Rama Varma and Dr Mathai. In the same train arrived KV: Krishnan Thampan the brother of the Raja of Kollengode. Visited the exhibition in the J.J. School of Arts. The prize pictures were a disappointment and the number of good works was small.

## Sunda-SJ 2nd F ebruar-SJ j 902

Made purchases and visited A.K Joshi's shop and Ms Jagmohandas. The former paid Rupees 1,000 being the December instalment of the [+++] money of the press. Left Bombay by Mail [at] night.

## Monda-SJ 3rd F ebruar-SJ 1902

I had the company of Mirza Hiazah Khan a high official of the Hyderabad State. He was a very kind and courteous man and proved an agreeable companion. The plague authorities did not give me any trouble. I had only to take a pass. Secunderabad again.

## T uesda-SJ +th F ebruar-SJ 1902

As I had a [no] plague pass I had to walk all the way to the Hospital to submit myself for examination; I could get no carriage. The doctor promised to send a nurse to my place on payment of Rs 2 from tomorrow.
