${ m T}$ uesda~ 5th March 190 j

This morning Brother's temperature has gone down though he still suffers from cough. In the evening I sketched Mr Chinubhai's head. Brother better though still weak. I am suffering terribly from cough.

Wednesda~ 6th March 1901

The first coat of colour to Chinubhai's face was given by me and the likeness is good. Received a letter from the Dewan of Multran [Mudhol]that he would arrange for our halting there on our way to Udaipur. Departure postponed to the 12th.

Thursda~ 7th March 1901

I felt feverish last night. We could not work, in the afternoon. I became worse and in the evening the temperature rose to 104[.] Dr Soloman Enulkar called in the evening and prescribed a mixture.

Frida~ 8th March j 901

I am better this morning; the fever has gone down and yet I have a severe cold only. I took my amount of quinine; all work at standstill. Ms Madhavalal gave a second sitting but very little work was done.

5aturda~ 9th March 1 901

This morning we are both much better. Brother's headache and my fever have left us. Mr Chimanlal wants his portrait to be a three quarter and not a bust. The first sketch was made this evening.

5unda~ 10th March 190 j

We both bathed and feel stronger. Mr Chinubhai gave his second sitting and Mr Chimanlal his first though late in the evening. Visited the library of the former which contains a good collection of standard works.

Monda~ 1 j th March 1 901

Had a second sitting from Mr Chinubhai in the morning and in the evening a sitting from Mr Chimanlal. The heat is gradually being felt and thirst is daily increasing. In the evening however there is a cool breeze.

${ m T}$ uesda~ 12th March j 901

Received a reply from the Director of Public Instructions, Madras to say that the Marathi Primers submitted have been referred to the Book Committee. In the evening drove to Ms Chinubhai's Bungalow in the Camp and returned home after a long drive. Purchased four cholis for the marriage of Mr K.P. Sankaran Menon.
