Wednesda-y J 3th March J 901

This morning, Nephew became unwell and we were afraid whether we should be obliged to postpone departure again. We made every arrangement for departure, and towards evening Nephew's health improved. We did not go out in the evening but remained at home packing things [and] getting things ready. Dr S.A. Enulkar declined to charge any fee [for] treating us.

Thursda-y J +th March J 901

We were up at 4 in the morning and therefore could catch the train at 6. Changed at Anand to the Godhra-Ratlam line. Travelled over this line for the first time. The country hilly and jungly and rises gradually. Radam was reached at 4 p.m.; were received on behalf of Durbar by our old friend Rukhmalkji and Mr Imayat Hussain Sheristhadar, Dewan's office. Our lodgings were in a cool and pleasant garden, [the] arrangements were perfect. VISited the Raja and his Dewan Mr Curselji Rustamji in the evening at 7. Enjoyed rest from the fatigues of the journey.

Frida-y 15th March J 90 J

Left Radam early in the morning and arrived at Chitorgadh in the evening at 5. The old fort celebrated in history rose in front of us; but we could not visit it owing to the late arrival of the train. We put up at the waiting room taking our meals in a small serai. Slept at night in the 1st class compartment in which we were to travel.

5aturda-y J 6th March 1 90 J

Leaving Chitorgadh at 4 a.m. we arrived at Udaipur at 9 a.m. The city is built in the midst of hills on the shores of a lake. We drove to our residence in Durbari carriages. We were first disappointed with the house we were provided with; but its beautiful situation on the brink of the lake made ample amends for the short-comings of the place. In the evening we drove through the public gardens, a cool and beautifully laid out park.

5unda-y J 7th March 1 901

This is my 41st birthday and I never expected that I [would] have [to] spend this day at Udaipur. I had a plunge bath in the cool waters of the lake. I began a sketch of the city on the other side of the lake in the morning. In the evening we crossed in a boat to the place to the other side of the lake and saw the Durbar Hall and the new palace being built. The inlaid work is beautiful. Mr Hamir Singh showed us round.

Monda-y j 8th March J 90 J

This evening we crossed over to the palace at about 7 and paid a visit to H.H. the Maharana Saheb. He is past middle age and is
