



Tuesday~ 14th February~ 1899

The papers received today contained full details of the Poona tragedy, It is certain that [+++] [Vasudev Chapekar] will follow his brothers to the gallows. Letters received from home continued to say that H.H. The Senior Rani was very [+++] [angry] at Appay's resolution to give up his studies and take to painting.

Wednesday~ 15th February~ 1899

Received a letter from cousin K.R.R. saying that we have won the Gonan pallikara case in the Zilla court and that father was gradually sinking. I am writing to him today to do every thing for his comfort and convenience. It is a source of great sorrow that we are not able to attend on him.

Thursday~ 16th February~ 1899

This afternoon a man by name Bal Krishna Vishvanath Da [?] B.A. came and like an interviewer put a lot of questions regarding Brother's life and art to which we answered. Near the railway station below our bungalow plague sheds were erected. Arrangements have been made to disinfect those Bombay passengers who alight here.

Friday~ 17th February~ 1899

The Poona Brahmin in charge of the newly started disinfection camp requested to be allowed to take his meals with us, as he has no friends or relations and as his caste people at Bhaji were not hospitable enough. He is a poor man and we allowed him to do so. Walked to Karli tank in the evening.

Saturday~ 18th February~ 1899

Received a letter from Seta Rao at the desire of H.H. the Gaikwar asking us if we could find a Namboodiri Brahmin 108 for the Badrinath Temple as requested by the Tehri Raja to whom Government has made over the management of it. We wrote in reply to ascertain the remuneration and [+++].

Sunday~ 19th February~ 1899

I wrote a letter to H.H. the 1st prince in reply to H.H.'s of the 14th. I walked to Karli early in the morning to study how the cities look in the grey of the morning. It was so cold, I thought my hands would freeze. Wrote to Schleicher to send statements of the liabilities of the press.

Monday~ 20th February~ 1899

Appay and myself went to the well side to see the passengers who alighted here being disinfected. When they saw Doctor Haq, [they] came and complained
