### 5aturda~ 6th April 1 901

There was another Gangor procession this evening. Yesterday it appears was the birth day of the God of Ekling131 and there were sports in the arena.

We saw the procession from the terrace of our house. It was a repetition of these we had seen before.

### Monda~ 8th April 1 90]

Ms Fatehlal called on us this morning. He is the son of Rai Pannalal C.I S. late Dewan of Udaipur. Fatehlal is an accomplished young man and seems to be in high favour with the Maharana. He liked our painting of Raj Singh and has promised to appoint a time for showing it to His Highness.

# T uesda~ 9th April 1 90]

We learnt with extreme sorrow from the papers about the death of Ms Madhavalal Ramhorilal, the father of Chinubhai our friend. He was only about

60 years of age and when we left Ahmedabad he was in good health. But on the 4th instant he died suddenly of heart disease. He was a very charitable and good man. Sent telegram of condolence to Mr Chinubhai.

## W ednesda~ ] oth April 1 90]

At about 10 this morning we received information that His Highness was ready to see us and the picture of Raj Singh. We went accordingly. Mr Fatehlal met us and we awaited the arrival of the Maharana in the western veranda of the Durbar Hall. His Highness did not make any criticism and seemed to like the work. Ms Fatehlal will let us know if any more orders there are.

### Thursda~ ] ] th April 1 90]

We were expecting Mr Fatehlalji in the morning, but he did not turn up. In the evening we took a drive through the park visiting the museum and menagerie and on return home[,] Learnt that Fatehlalji had called soon after our departure.
